He was also instrumental in introducing Digital Library, Digital Talking Book Library, Morning Views Corner for Editorials of Newspapers and Cartoon Corner. Yet another of his popular and timely venture was the starting of the Best User Award

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introduced for library users which created a user-friendly atmosphere in the campus. Equally valuable was Mr. Ayub's role as the Director of Publications. He published ten issues of Campus Vibes and four books during the tenure of his directorship. He also took initiative in bringing out four substantial volumes relating to the background, history and tradition of Farook College and sister-institutions in the campus. Mr. Ayub thus proved himself to be a truly reliable and useful asset to the library. No wonder, therefore, with his up-to-date knowledge of library and information science and spirit of team work he proved himself to be a people's librarian practically coping the visions of Dr. S. R. Ranganathan.

It was indeed remarkable that throughout his professional career as a librarian, he had remained really capable but not vociferous of his own abilities. # M. AYUB A Dedicated College Librarian

Mr. Mullath Ayub, a staunch believer in practicing profession with an illustrious career in college librarianship for more than three decades, has committed himself to the library profession. He was born on 12th December 1957 at Calicut as the youngest son of a leading advocate practicing in the city. His father Adv. M. V. Hydrose, a member of the Madras Legislative Council (MLC) was a great visionary of the times and one of the founders of the Rouzathul Uloom Association (RUA), the parent body of Farook College and its sister institutions, which took the lead in transforming the social fabric of the region through the expansion of the secular educational structure and in uplifting the backward Muslim community of the Malabar region by paving the road to higher education.

Mr. Ayub had his early childhood days at Shishu class of the Madrasathul Mohammedia Primary School where he had completed his primary education till VII<sup>th</sup> Class. He was brought up in Farook College campus in 1971 for his secondary education at Farook High School which was running at the time under the patronage of the great teacher Mr. P. A. Latheef who was then the Headmaster. He was an inmate of the Raja Hostel located in the campus for three years during his high school days.

After completing the high school education, Mr. Ayub moved in 1975 for his higher education to the Aligarh Muslim University (A.M.U.) where he had completed Pre-University Course (PUC) and Bachelor of Arts in Economics (B.A. Eco.). He had also completed his Bachelor and Master Degrees in library science at A.M.U. His elder brothers Adv. M. Mohammed and Adv. M. Jamaludheen were the persons who persuaded him to go to Aligarh for his higher education.

Mr. Ayub got enrolled in the Dept. of Library Science for the Bachelor Degree (B.Lib.Sc.) course at Aligarh after completing his graduation in Economics in 1979. It was the ardent impression that he had with the well organized University Central Library housed in a splendid and elegant edifice opened by the first Prime Minister of India Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru in 1964 and named after Moulana Abul Kalam Azad, the first Cabinet Minister for Education in the Union Govt. of India, made his mind to take up the library science course for his career. He had truly experienced the services rendered by the Moulana Azad Library while undergoing the graduate course at Aligarh. It was also his conviction of library science course being a professional one that led him to join this course leaving behind the M. A. Economics course for which he was selected. The seniors in his department and hostel had their role in leading him to this decision. He recollects Dr. M. Abdul Azeez, a research scholar for Ph. D. degree in the Dept. of Economics who later became Professor of Economics in P. S. M. O. College at Tirurangadi, Kerala, among the seniors who encouraged him to join the library science course at Aligarh. After completing the Bachelor Degree course in Library Science he was selected for admission to the Master Degree course in Library Science (M.Lib.Sc.) by screening through a written test and an interview chaired by Prof. Irfan Habib, the great scholar and historian who was then the Dean of Social Science Faculty under which the Dept. of Library Science comes.

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Prof. M. H. Rizvi was the University Librarian and Chairman of the Dept. of Library Science. Dr. Ishrath Ali Quereshi, Prof. Sirajudheen, Prof. Sabir Hussain and Mr. Hassan Zamrud were the faculty members of library science. Mr. Shamshad Ahamed who working as librarian in JN Medical College of AMU and Mr. Sunil Kesari who later became the librarian, Parliament Lbrary were among his batch mates in Master Degree Course. Mr. Musthafa Zaidi was the youngest faculty member who joined the Dept. fresh and he was teaching library classification theory and practice.

Mr. Ayub had entered the library profession even before completing his Master Degree course in Library Science. When the course was almost coming to an end and he was to write a dissertation for the Master Degree the University was closed indefinitely due to some internal problems erupted in the University Campus. The students were directed to vacate the hostels and to go home. Mr. Ayub returned to his home town Calicut along with other students from Kerala and got himself so engaged in completing the dissertation work that he could submit the dissertation and complete the course once the University is reopened. He was working for the dissertation under the supervision of Dr. Ishrath Ali Qureshi, University Deputy Librarian at Aligarh. When the dissertation work was in progress at his hometown he used to visit the libraries in Farook College and Calicut University for the dissertation work.

Meanwhile the post of librarian which was lying vacant for more than one year in Farook College was notified and it was for the third time the post was notified as no qualified person turned up to join the temporary vacant post due to the leave granted to the college librarian who had gone to take up a job of librarian abroad. The vacant post of librarian in Farook College came to his notice and Mr. Ayub applied in response to the notification for the post of librarian. He was persuaded to apply for

the post of librarian by some of the teachers whom he got introduced to while working for dissertation in the Farook College Library. Prof. U. Mohamed in the Dept. of English who later became the Principal of the College and Prof. A. P. Abdurahiman in the Dept. of Islamic History were the two teachers worthwhile to be particularly mentioned in this regard. Some of the seniors with whom he was staying at Aligarh had by the time become the teachers in 'Farook College and they also encouraged him to take up the assignment of librarian at Farook College. Mr. Ayub was one of the two applicants for this temporary post and he was called for an interview. Mr. Ayub was selected for this post of librarian and he joined the college on 28th July 1981. He worked in the college for one month and then he had to leave for Aligarh to submit the dissertation and complete the M.Lib.Sc.course. Once he completed the course Mr. Ayub came back to Farook College to rejoin the post of librarian on 1st January 1982 and his service was regularized in this post of College Librarian in July 1983.

The skeleton staff put into the college library service was not technically qualified and they were not competent enough to discharge the house keeping jobs in such a reasonably large library with a collection of about forty thousand books and 240 periodicals. Mr. Ayub with his acumen managerial skills and gentle attitude coupled with his professional workmanship was able to bring back into order within reasonable time the library which was almost plunged into disorder and a shattered collection as the librarian was on leave. The first task before him as a librarian was the stock taking of the library collection which had dropped half way after the former librarian left for a job abroad. The next task that he accomplished was the reorganization of sections of library collection in the order of Colon Classification schedule which was adopted in the library for organizing its collection. Mr. Ayub could put the library collection in order and make

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the library functional with all the routine jobs in a college library like membership subscription and renewal, issue of user tickets, book bank loan etc. put in order within a reasonable time with the cooperation of library staff and teachers.

The postgraduate block of the library was extended during the early days of his tenure and more facilities were provided to postgraduate students, research scholars and teachers. The working hours of the library were extended from 8.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. Mr. Ayub took initiative for retro conversion of the library collection organized with Colon Classification scheme to Dewey Decimal Classification scheme as a precedent to the computerization of library services which he could complete with locally developed library software package 'Book Magic' installed in 1996.

Mr. Ayub also put several strides in library science education and library professional training. He took initiative for launching a Bachelor Degree Course in Library and Information Science (B.L.I.Sc.) in 1994 and later it became a full fledged postgraduate department offering graduate (B.L.I.Sc.) and postgraduate (M.L.I.Sc.) courses in library and information science. He was teaching cataloguing practice for B.L.I.Sc. Course in the Dept. since its inception. He also conducted a number of training programmes for college librarians under the auspices of many projects like College with Potential for Excellence (a UGC project), Campus Diversity Initiative etc.

Mr. Ayub served for a stint as the Director of Certificate Course in Library Science conducted by the Kerala Grandhsala Sangham and he was teaching for the certificate course. He was also an academic counselor of B.L.I.Sc. programme of IGNOU at Calicut Study Centr for four years. Mr. Ayub participated as part of improving his professional knowledge and skills in several orientation and refresher courses conducted by UGC

Academic Staff Colleges and attended many training programmes and workshops conducted by the Universities and Govt. Agencies throughout his career. Mr. Ayub served as a member in the Executive Committee of State Library Council for one term during the period 1994-99 and also an Expert Committee Member of the Council for two years during 2006-07. He was also a Member of Advisory Committee of the State Central Library at Trivandrum. Mr. Ayub was a member of the Expert Committee on College Libraries constituted by the Govt. of Kerala in 1994. He was a member in the Board of Studies in Library and Information Science of Calicut University for two years during 2012-13. He also served as a member or a functionary of many social and educational societies and institutions in and around Calicut.

A major landmark during his tenure was the shifting of the college library into an elegant building with Kerala architecture named after Moulana Abussabah, the great visionary and founder of Farook College and its sister institutions on the campus. The concept of a separate building for college library was first mooted by Prof. U. Mohamed when he was the Principal in 1986. The new library project was implemented during the tenure of Dr. P. M. Mubarak Pasha as the Principal. The Abussabah Library Complex was commissioned by A. P. J. Abdul Kalam, former President of India on 17th Nov. 2002. Besides the library and information system, the new complex houses the Department of Library and Information Science and an air-conditioned Audio-Visual Theatre with facilities for Internet access and digital presentation.

The retro conversion of library collection from Colon Classification to Dewey Decimal Classification and computerization of library services were completed after shifting the library into the new complex. Sections were again reorganized and open access was provided to the M. Ayub (xxix)

undergraduate students also in the new library. The entire library collection was reorganized in two parallel collections according to Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme – one for postgraduate students and another for undergraduate students.

Mr. Ayub envisaged the concept of a hybrid library with a digital library developed along with the traditional library collection and services in the Farook College Library and Information System. A digital library along with the application of ICT in the traditional library services would reinforce quality library and information services and provide user satisfaction. A proposal for a digital library project was submitted for a govt. grant under MPLAD scheme of Mr. P. V. Abdul Wahab, Member of Parliament and the digital library was launched in 2009. An institutional repository was developed with the digital version of college magazines, souvenirs and rare documents in the digital library. A project was undertaken for the digitization of rare documents under the CPE project. Farook College library has since beginning a good collection of Braille books. The ICT is also applied in library services for visually challenged students. A Digital Talking Book Library was developed with the help of software 'JAWS' in 2007. The digital library for visually challenged students has become significant in the Farook College campus as many such boys and girls are undergoing undergraduate and postgraduate courses in the college and many of them are staying in the college hostels.

Mr. Ayub took a good deal of interest and initiative in the application of ICT in all areas of library management and services. A library website was developed in 2007 and linked with the Farook College site. The bibliographical database developed in the college library was made accessible online through Web OPAC in 2009. Farook College is one of the first libraries in the country selected for the N-List online information service of a rich

collection of e-books and e-journals made available through UGC Library and Information Network Programme (INFLIBNET).

Mr. Ayub introduced a monthly content service of the current issues of the subject journals subscribed in the library under the title 'Scanner' and circulated among the teachers, research scholars and postgraduate students of the departments and other wings of the college. A news corner was installed under the label 'Morning Views' at the entrance of the library for the Editorials of Newspapers in English and vernacular languages. A 'Cartoon Corner' was put in place to reflect the public opinions and social criticism of the contemporary political, social and cultural issues. He also introduced a Best User Award for library users which became popular among the students and created a userfriendly atmosphere in the campus. It was only during his tenure a Readers' Forum was formed with the aim of inculcating reading habit among the students and introducing to the students the newly published books authored by noted and contemporary writers in literature, culture and on emerging social issues.

Mr. Ayub serves as the Director of Publications Division of the college. Ten issues of the annual college news letter entitled 'Campus Vibes' and four books authored by the teachers of the Farook College were published during the tenure of his directorship. He also took initiative in bringing out four substantial souvenirs depicting the history, development and traditions of Farook College on the occasion of jubilee celebrations and other events.

Mr. Ayub puts on record his sincere gratitude for the whole-hearted support and encouragement rendered by all the former principals and members of College Managing Committee during his tenure as college librarian for achieving all these landmark developments in the college library services. He would like to recollect M. Ayub (xxxi)

the late Mr. K. C. Hassan Kutty saheb, the Secretary of College Managing Committee for a long term, who was always kind enough to listen to the grievances, problems and requirements of the college library, for his seamless inspiration given throughout the career of Mr. Ayub.

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**Dr.M.Bavakutty**, a senior LIS professional in the country, served as Dean of Humanities, University Librarian, Professor and Head of the Dept. of LIS, Registrar, University of Calicut. He had the unique honour to establish LIS Depts. and to organise and start LIS

post graduate and research courses in three universities, viz University of Calicut, Pondicherry University and Kannur University in 1978, 2007 and 2009 respectively. There are a number of books and hundreds of professional papers in his credit. He is a research guide of several universities
