BACKGROUND

BENGAL LIBRARY ASSOCIATION

Bengal Library Association, formerly known as, All Bengal Library Association was established on 20th December, 1925 in Kolkata under the presidentship of Poet Rabindranath Tagore and the first secretary of the Association was Mr. Sushilkumar Ghosh. The major activities of the Association are: Propagating the importance of library and information services for individuals and for the society and developing awareness for the library and information services; Suggesting measures for improvement and expansion of library services for all categories of libraries in the state; Organizing movement for improvement of the service conditions and proper pay and status of the library workers; Organizing conference and seminars for apprising people of various aspects of the library movement and library services; Organizing training courses, refresher courses, workshops etc. and publishing books, periodicals, reports etc. pertaining to library science and library services; etc.

Among different programmes of the Association, one of the important programmes is to modernize libraries in the state. For this purpose, on the request of Govt. of West

Bengal, the Association organized a training programme for the librarians working in different Town Libraries in West Bengal in 2011 and later installed open source library management software Koha to 170 Town Libraries in the state. Since then the Association regularly organizes training programmes on Koha, customizes the software for different types of libraries, encourages libraries in implementing Koha, etc. It is a new challenge to the Association to organize 'Indkoha 2016'.

BOSE INSTITUTE

Bose Institute was founded by Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose, F.R.S., in Calcutta on 30th November, 1917, with the purpose of investigating fully "the many and ever opening problems of the nascent science which includes both life and non-life". The institute was one of the earliest, perhaps the first modern research institute in India. Acharya Bose is generally acknowledged as the father of modern scientific research in India. His early career included many marvelously inventive and pioneering experiments on electromagnetism which, in J. J. Thomson's words, marked "the dawn of the revival in India, of interest in researches in the Physical Sciences", and on the commonality of the response of plants and inorganic materials to electric and mechanical stimuli. Those early successes lay behind the stated purpose. Acharya Bose's successors remained true to that purpose.

It is, therefore, not surprising to find the research activities of this Institute today spanning a wide compass, a feature that makes it unique amongst all research institutes in India. The Institute's 600 staff and students mostly work out of two campuses in the city of Kolkata, which house its various academic departments and sections, together with a Library and other service units. The J.C. Bose Museum is a special attraction in the Main Campus. It houses a fine collection of the manuscripts, instruments etc. that record Acharya Bose's life and work; these are on permanent display. In addition, there are four special purpose Field Stations. In an independent assessment of research activities in India by the National Information System for Sciences & Technology (NISSAT) of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, the research work from Bose Institute was rated High impact in Biology and Biomedical research areas.

The Centenary Celebration of this Institute will start from 30th November, 2015. Being a part of this programme, 'Indkoha 2016: Two-day National Conference on Koha' will be organized in its auditorium on 23rd and 24th January, 2016.

REACHING KOLKATA, TRANSPORT AND WEATHER

Kolkata, formerly known as Calcutta, was the capital of British India until 1911 and at present is the capital of West Bengal. This historical city is located on the east bank of the Hooghly River and it is one of the most important metropolises in the country. The Port of Kolkata is India's oldest operating port and its sole major riverine port. At present, the city has about 6 million residents and if includes surrounding areas (known as greater Kolkata) the total population is about 15 million and it is one of the most populated cities in India. The city is recognized as the cultural capital of India.

The Conference Hall is located at 93/3A/1, Acharya Prafulla Chandra Road, Kolkata — 700 009, near Raja Bazar Science College. It is within 1 km. (about 10 mins. distance) from Sealdah Railway Station, within 5 kms. (about 30 mins. distance) from Howrah Railway Station and within 14 kms.

(about 45 mins. distance) from Kolkata International Airport. So the Conference Hall is more or less centrally located in the city.

Kolkata has a Tropical wet-and-dry climate. The annual mean temperature is 24.8°C; monthly mean temperature ranges from 15°C to 30°C. The month of January is within the Winter Season and maximum and minimum temperature ranges between 25°C to 13°C. Over the course of January, the length of the day is more or less constant and the length of daylight varies between 10:47 hours to 11:07 hours. The relative humidity typically ranges from 42% to 95% throughout this month. More or less, there is a pleasant weather in the month of January in Kolkata.

The length of the paper should be within 6 pages (of A4 size, margin: Left: 1.25" & Top, Bottom, Right: 1" each) including abstract, tables & figures, annexure and references. The reference should follow APA Style (http://apastyle.org/). Papers will be reviewed by the subject experts and the selected papers will be allowed for presentation in the Conference. Only soft copy of paper will be accepted and the paper must be sent to: indkoha2016@gmail.com with a heading 'Paper For Indkoha 2016'
